- A team of teachers, PTA executive committee members and students of grade V C visited **Little Flower Home for Handicapped, Karunalayam Convent, Maranalloor**. Our team spent time with the 35 inmates giving them happy memorable moments through various programmes presented by the students and by playing fun games together.
- The students of grade VI A visited **St. Theresa's Children's Home, Konniyoor** where they spend hours with the 16 children by playing and performing with them.
- A visit to the **Mission India Mercy Home, Mulayara** was done by grade VI B. They played together and performed various programmes.
- The students of grade VI C visited **Devine Mercy Old Age Home, Plavoor, Kattakkada**. They spend quality time with the 28 inmates and organized various programmes to entertain them.
- **Devine Mercy Home, Aramada** was visited by the students of grade VII A. There they spend time with 35 children by playing and

performing with them.

- A visit to **Bethel Gram, Mukkola** was done by the students of grade VII B. Our children entertained them by performing various cultural programmes and the inmates of the institution also joined in it.
- **Christunilayam Children's Home, K S Road, Kovalam** was visited by the students of grade VIII A. Our students got an opportunity to interact with the 60 children of that institution and they played together and presented various cultural programmes.
- The students of VIII B visited **Swapnakoodu Old Age Home, Kunnappuzha**. Around 30 inmates were there and all of them were happy to welcome us and our children got a good opportunity to spend time with them.

- **Karunalayam Boys Home and Old Age Home, Amaravila** was visited by the students of grade IX B. Our team spent time with the 40 inmates of old age home and 4 children of boys home by giving them happy memorable moments through various programmes and playing fun games together.
